How many dancers can enter? Only 8 dancers per age group can enter!

What can I expect?

Round 1: Dancers in each level will freestyle to a song in the first round of the challenge. We will "rock paper scissors" to find out who goes first.

The song choices will be played at random and will change after 2 dancers have improvised. After the first round, the faculty will deliberate and advance 4 dancers on to the next round.

Round 2 will challenge the dancers with a new style of song...it could be old school, hip hop, house...etc We will "rock paper scissors" to find out who goes first.

The song choices will be played at random and will change after 2 dancers have improvised. After the second round, the faculty will deliberate and advance 2 dancers to the final round.

Round 3 will challenge the dancers with a completely different style of song!

We will "rock paper scissors" to find out who goes first.

Both dancers will improvise to the same song.

After this third round, the faculty will deliberate and choose the winner of the Prove Your Groove Solo Improv Challenge!

The winner in each level receives:

- An original "Prove Your Groove Solo Improv Challenge" T-shirt!
- A "V.I.P Pass" for next season (a special pass that provides a 20% discount on registration fees for next season...up to \$50 value!)

Alex Pesusich, originally from Denver Colorado, started his training in hip hop, jazz, ballet, and tap - but his training hasn't stopped there... Soon to follow was: house, locking, popping & breaking!

Upon moving to Los Angeles, Alex worked as both a dancer and choreographer for many different recording artists. Such artists include: Foxy Brown, Toni Braxton, Will Smith, The Backstreet Boys, Usher, Carmen Electra, Atomic Kitten, Bif Naked, Matthew Good, & Elise Estrada.

Television and film credits include Fox's VIBE with Sinbad, where Alex choreographed and performed with artists such as Martha Wash of C+C Music Factory, Sharon Stone, LSG, Run DMC, DJ's Jazzy Jeff, DJ RUN and DJ Scribble.

Alex was able to share his choreographic skills with prime time audiences by choreographing two episodes for "Kyle XY". Alex choreographed the #1 single for Elise Estrada; "Insatiable".

He also choreographed her Canadian tour opening up for Rhianna & Enrique Iglasias.

Feature films Alex has worked on include: "Red Riding Hood", "Kickin' It Old School", (where he got to work along side one of the pioneers of locking, Shabba Doo), "This Means War", "Scooby Doo 2: Monsters Unleashed", "Reefer Madness", "The Score" and "Dr. Doolittle 3" and "Hellcats".

Alex's notoriety as someone who has such a wide range of knowledge in almost all forms of hip hop dance, as well as years of practical experience has pushed him to the world stage by judging the World Hip Hop Championships held in Los Angeles.


Joanne was nominated 'Best Female Hip Hop Dancer" at the prestigious RAD (Recognition Awards for Dancers") Awards in Los Angeles. She was the choreographer for the feature film, "Saving Silverman" and numerous national & international commercials.

As a dancer, Joanne's credits include feature films "Kickin' It Old School" with Jamie Kennedy, as well as "The Cleaner" with Cedric The Entertainer, the Nickelodeon Movie Musical "Ragz" and the TV series "Once Upon a Time", "Scooby Doo 2: Monsters Unleashed" and "White Chicks" with Marlon and Damon Wayans.

Joanne was the assistant choreographer on the feature film TRON 2, and together with her husband Alex she choreographed the Finale for the "So You Think You Can Dance" Canadian Season 2 Tour. Joanne recently choreographed a TV movie, "Splitting Adam" which brought her back to her ballet roots!

Currently, Joanne is director of The Source Dance Company, a semi professional dance company based out of Harbour Dance Centre in Vancouver, BC. The company focuses on training and performance opportunities throughout the year, and offers aspiring professional dancers insight into the professional entertainment world and connections within the industry. As founder and artistic director of the award winning performance group, The Groovaloos, and co-creator and director of choreography of GROOVALOO, Bradley Rapier's goal has been to spread the power, beauty and endless creativity within the street dance culture with the world. He was born and raised in Canada. There, in high school, Bradley was recruited by StreetScape, the country's foremost street dancing troupe, introducing him to the magical qualities of the art form that drive him to this day. Previously on a medical career path like

his father, Bradley was changed forever. He went on to choreograph and perform nationally on all mediums and, after taking 1st place at a Canadian Talent Search and top honors in both Los Angeles and New York at the International IMTA Awards, Bradley relocated to the United States.


Soon after the move Bradley was honored with an American Choreography Award nomination and a Hip Hop Choreography Award for his outstanding commercial work. On the theater

front his cool style and creative approach on City Kid was touted as "miraculous" and "exhilarating" by the LA Times and garnered him both the 2008 Ovation and NAACP Award for Best Musical Choreography.

A visionary and storyteller, Bradley has led his Groovaloos through eleven years of growth and achievement. With special guest appearances on So You Think You Can Dance, The Ellen Show, Late Night with Jimmy Fallon, The Wayne Brady Show, and winning the overall Grand Championship on NBC's SuperStars of Dance, The Groovaloos continue to ignite the globe with their authentic approach to this art form. And with Off Broadway and touring of their critically acclaimed theatrical production, GROOVALOO, the movement continues. Most recently Bradley has begun work as associate choreographer under Broadway director Des McAnuff for the remount of the classic Andrew Lloyd Webber musical, Jesus Christ Superstar. The new production will open at the Stratford Shakespeare Festival June 2011.

His additional credits include performances and/or choreography for; Queen Latifah, Miley Cyrus, Brian McKnight, Diana Ross, Cameron Diaz, Alanis Morissette, Fat Boy Slim, My Wife & Kids, with commercials for McDonalds, Lincoln, Levi's, Jeep, and Sony. Bradley gives thanks to God for creating such an amazing form of movement, inspiration and self-expression.




In 1991, Gabriel "Wicket" Jaochico began his journey into hip hop culture by attending local showcases in San Francisco. These showcases featured performances of urban dance, emcee'n, dj-ing and graffiti art. The dance groups performed a mixture of styles such as hip hop, choreography, lockin, poppin, house and breakdancing (bboyin').

After watching these amazing groups that electrified the crowd. Wicket was mostly intrigued by the bboys. Wicket began practicing in his garage with friends and studied video footage religiously. One day while practicing in a friend's backyard, Wicket was noticed by an original member (Occy) of the world famous Renegade Rockers.


Later that week, Occy invited Wicket & his friends to a Renegades practice at SFSU. As time went on, Occy saw that they were talented and hungry. He realized that the new faces


at practice were the future of bboyin' and welcomed Wicket and his friends into the Renegades family.



After moving to LA, he began to land gigs with A-list stars such as Will Smith, LL Cool J. Omarion, Chris Brown, Christina Aguilera and Miley Cyrus.

He's also been invited yearly to teach workshops and to be a special guest judge at major bboy events worldwide. From being a spectator on the sidelines to becoming one of the most influential bboys in the world, Wicket continues to compete, perform and teach the knowledge of a true bboy.









Ferdinand Tocol is a Vancouver based dancer who has over 20 years of professional experience in jazz, ballet, musical theatre and hip hop. He has trained and performed with the best choreographers in New York, Los Angeles and Vancouver.
